

Center for Verification & Evaluation Transfer Update

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CVE Transfer Background

Currently:

- Veteran small businesses can compete for set-aside contracts at the VA through the Veterans First Contracting program. Businesses must be verified as a VOSB or SDVOSB to participate and must receive their verification through VA's Center for Verification and Evaluation (CVE).
- In addition, SDVOSBs can self-certify through SAM.gov and will be eligible to compete for set-aside contracts at most federal agencies. But, VA does not recognize SDVOSB self-certification.

However, **changes are coming** due to the National Defense Authorization Act of 2021 which officially requires CVE's responsibilities to be transferred to the SBA as of Jan 1. 2023.



SBA will be a one-stop shop for certification and contracting support for VOSBs and SDVOSBs.

CVE Transfer Next Steps


What does this mean for VOSBs and SDVOSBs?

- If you are a VOSB or SDVOSB certified through the VA and your certification is within 120 days
 from expiration between now and December 2022, please recertify with the VA now before the
 transfer is complete. Follow instructions provided in reminder emails from the VA. Your status will
 then transfer to the SBA.
- If you are a VOSB or SDVOSB certified through the VA and you're not up for recertification soon, no action is required. Your status will transfer to the SBA.
- If you are a **self-certified** SDVOSB, you will **need to become certified** in order to do business with the government once the transfer is effective on Jan. 1, 2023. Note:
 - Consider getting certified through the VA now (<u>vetbiz.va.gov/vip</u>). Your status will then transfer to the SBA.
 - After the transfer, you can keep your contract through the period of performance but to compete for any new sole source or set-aside contracts with the government in the future, then you will need to be certified through the SBA.



Top of Mind

CVE Migration Timeline


July '22 – Make award to vendor for CVE platform build October '22 – Onboard CVE Director, Support, Verification, and Risk leads

New platform user acceptance testing

December '22 – Onboard fifty percent remaining CVE staff

New platform optimization release from pilot

Final rule in place by Dec. 1











July - September '22 -

Leverage existing tech/develop new system.
SBA vendor coordinates with VA IT staff and contractors on integrations and data migration

November '22 – Begin process to transfer vendor for verification support, on-site audits/examinations, and customer support from VA to SBA

Coordinate with VA on certification pilot on new platform

January '23 – Onboard remaining CVE staff

Cut over to new platform
